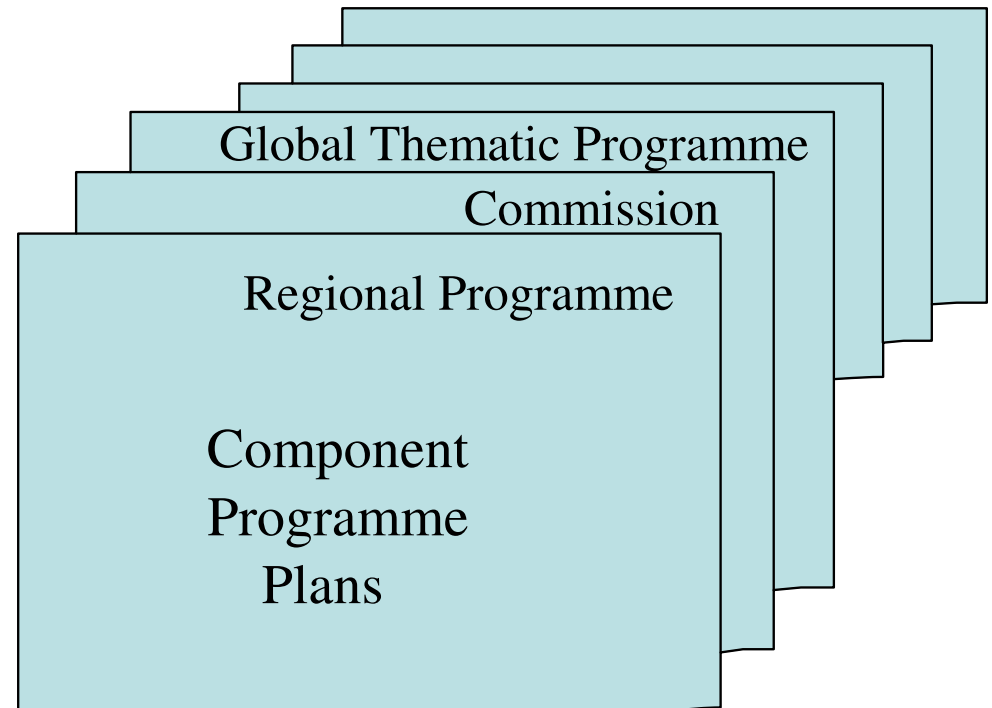
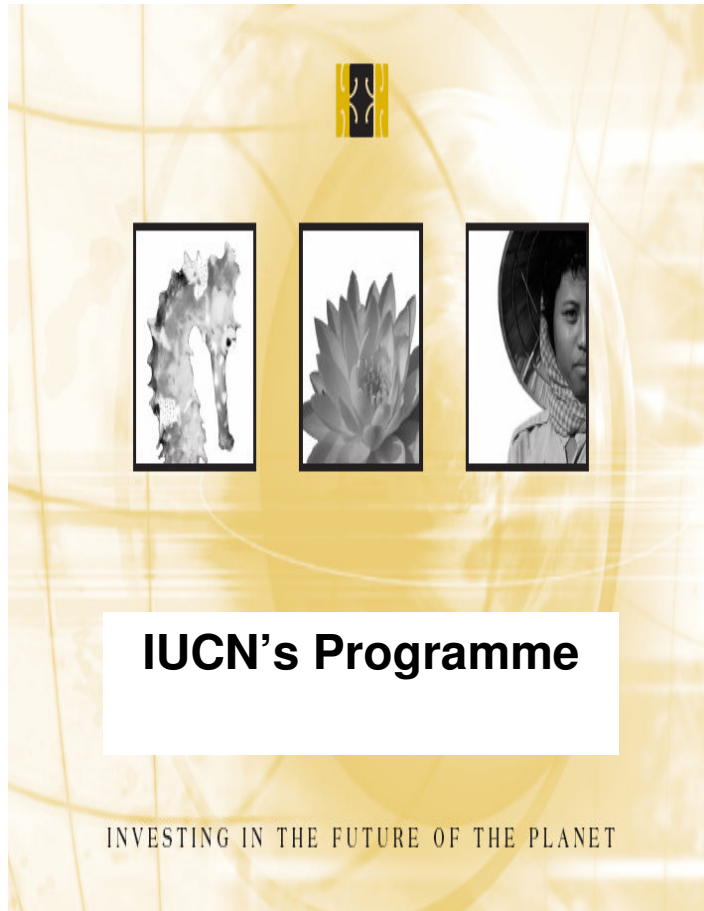

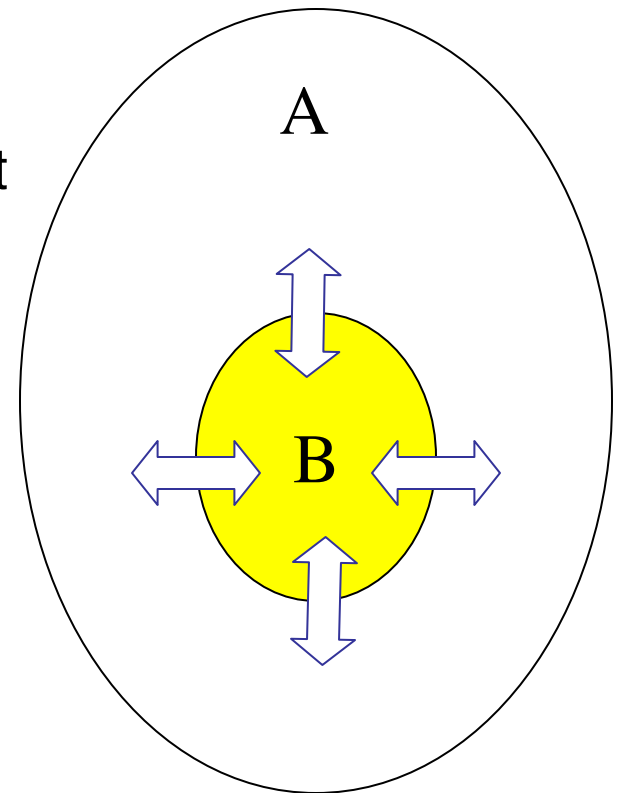


Each component programme has its own plan that fits within, and contributes to the IUCN Programme

A - The activities influenced by the Union for which the Secretariat and Commissions do not have direct accountability

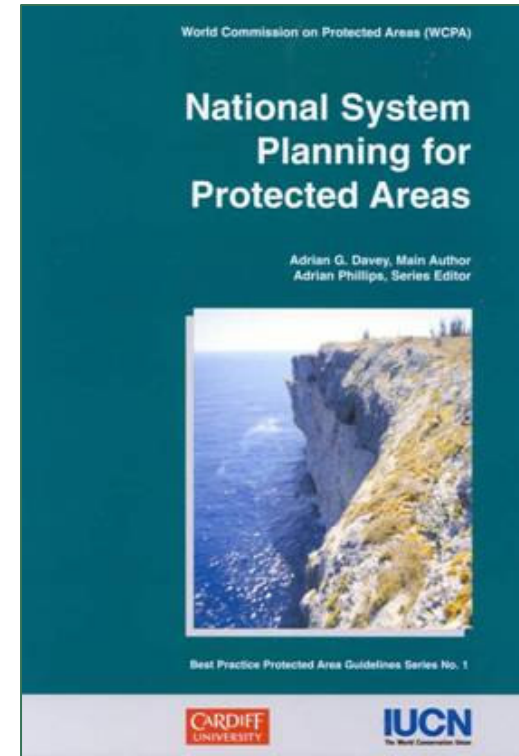
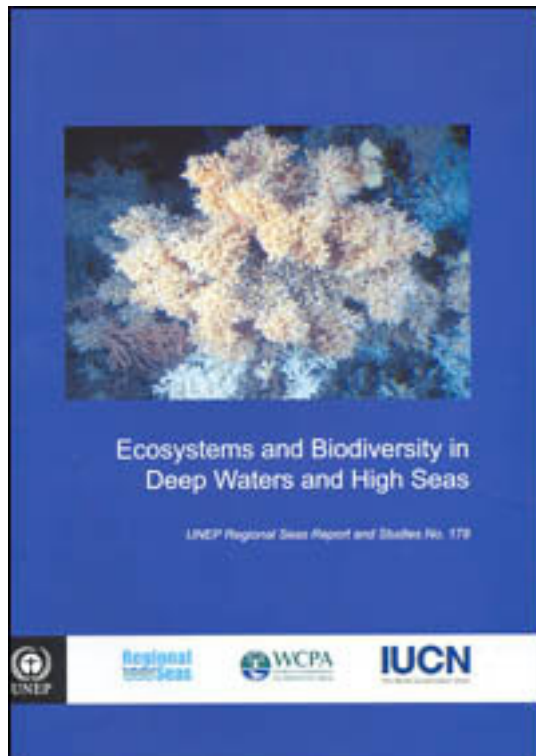
B The activities which the Secretariat and the Commissions are directly accountable for in terms of effectiveness and financial management

- Access to intergovernmental process through *UNGA* – *Observer status* and reputation

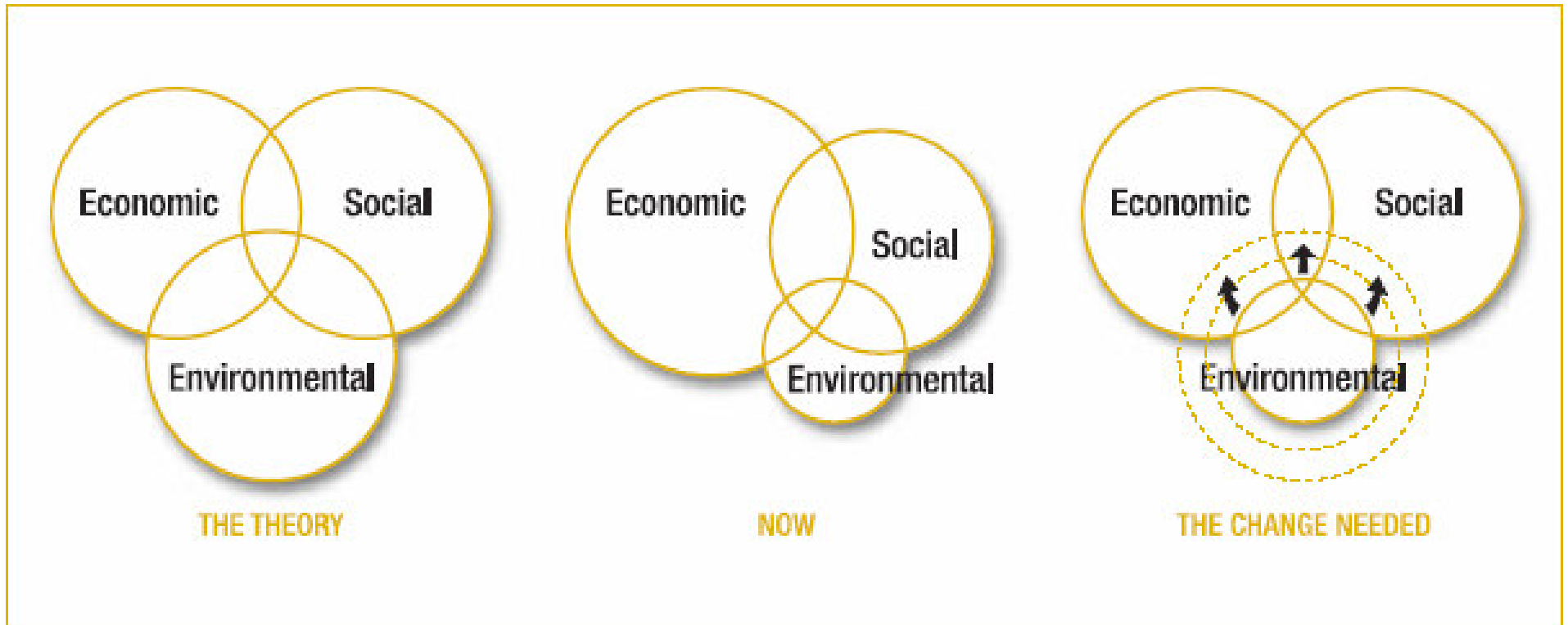

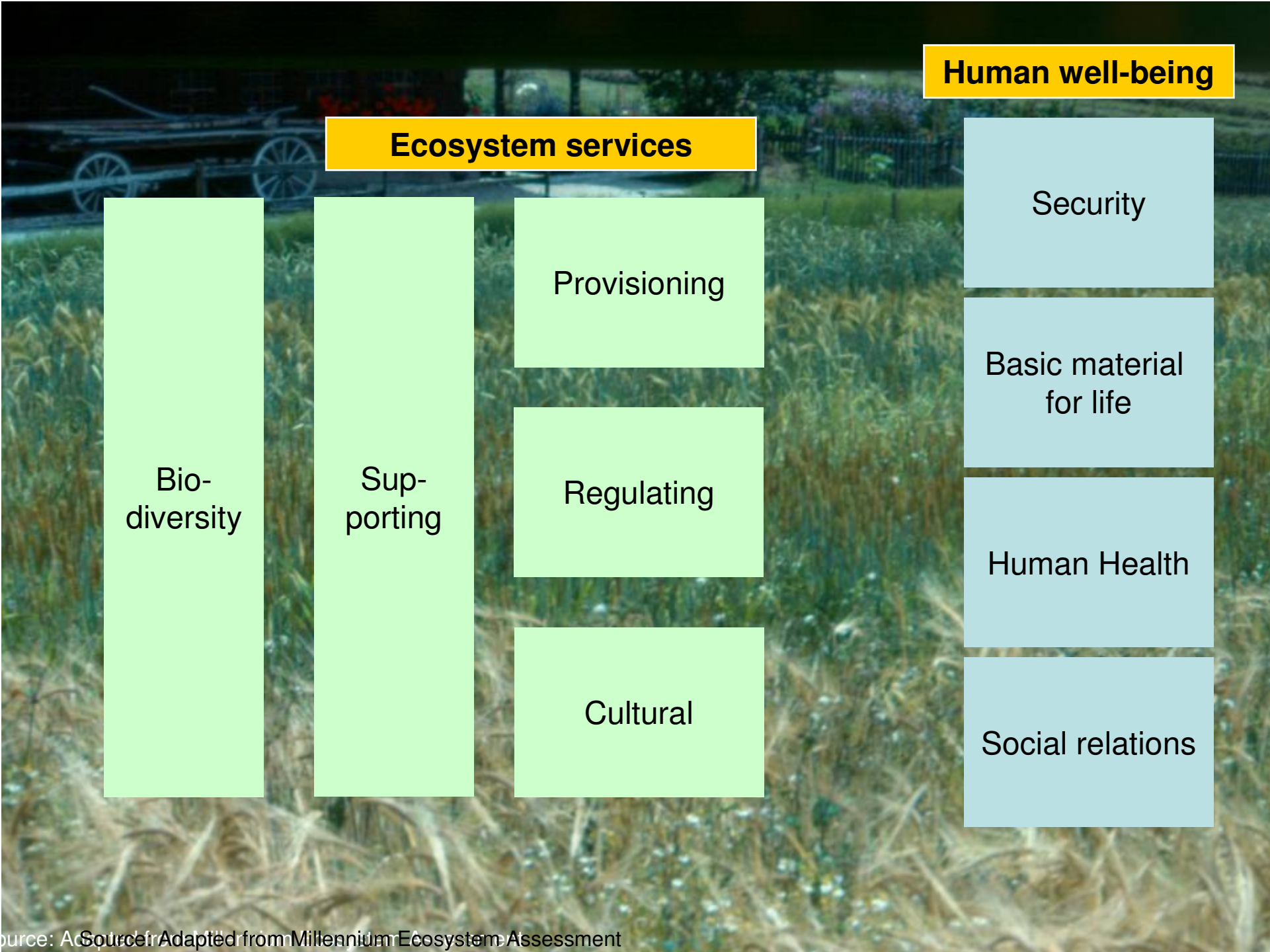

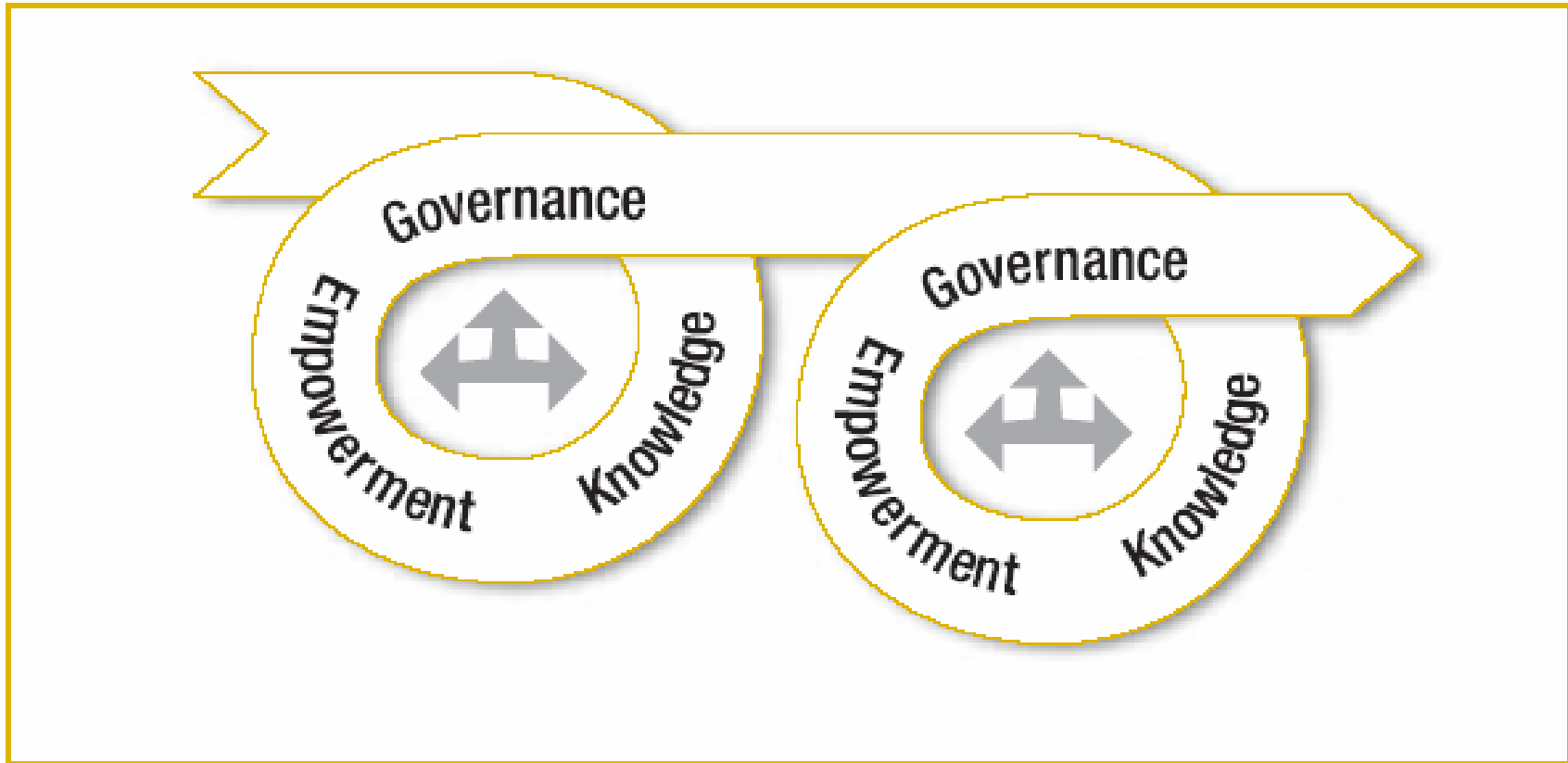
# Move to an even stronger model of sustainability



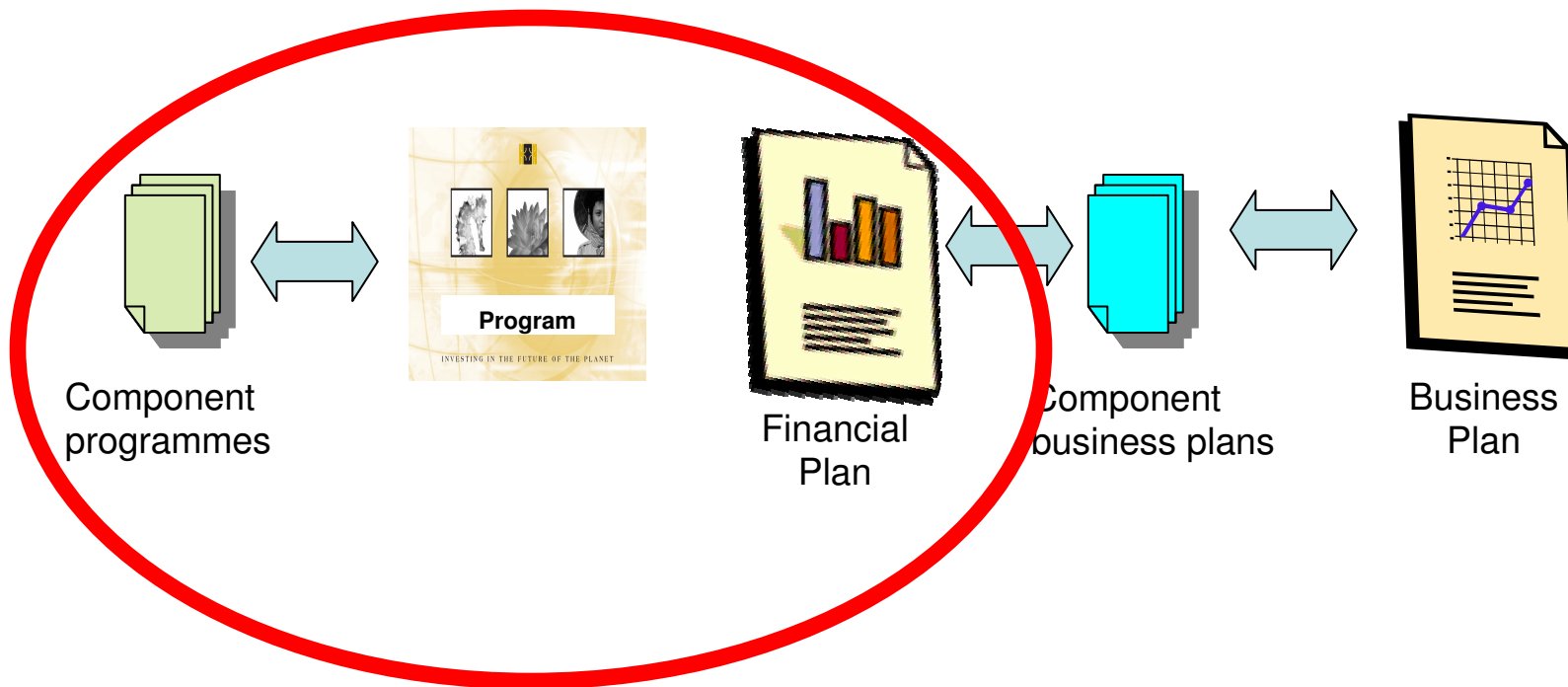

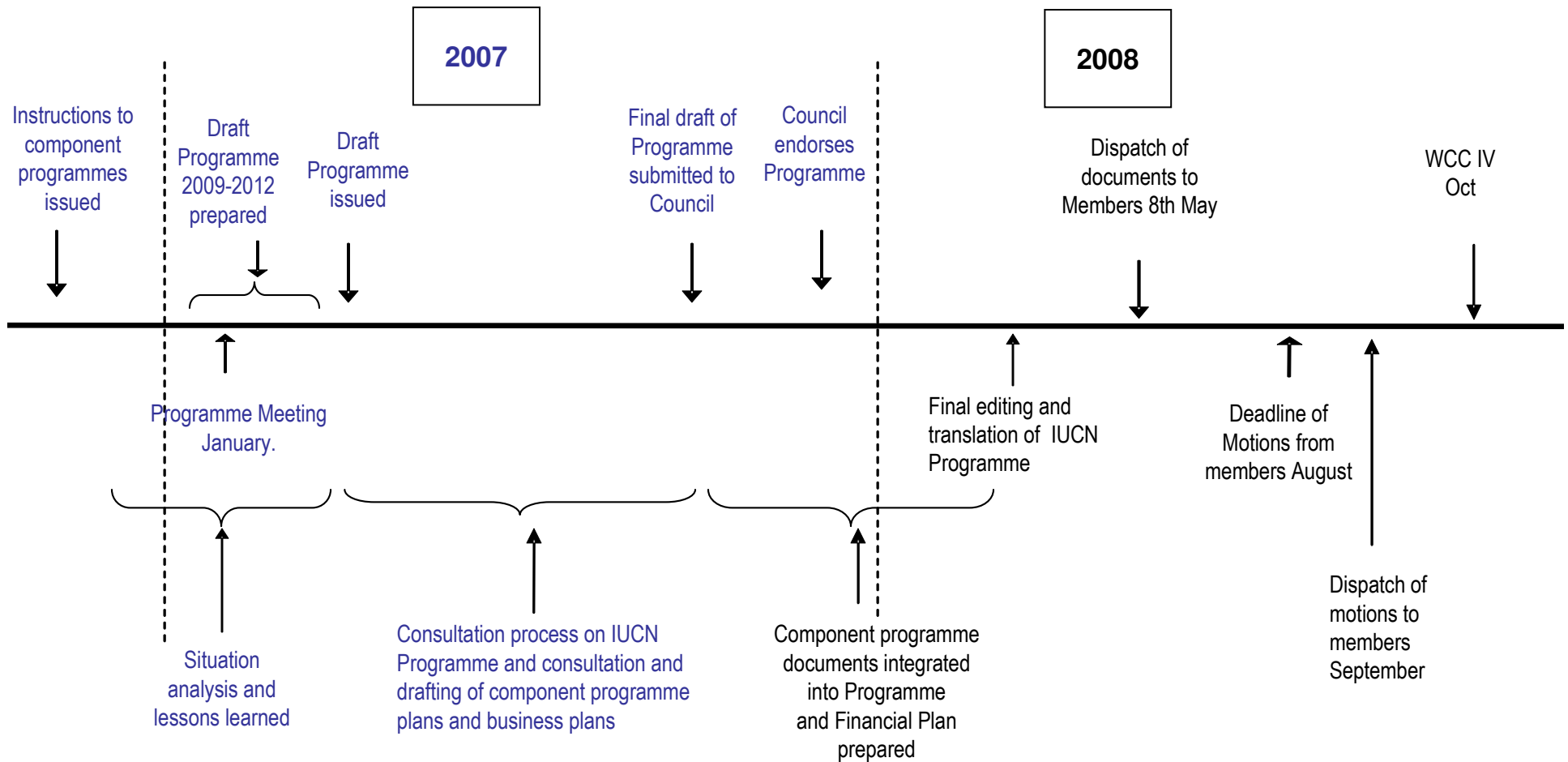
